

The annual EACMSI Spring Art Show is a festive and popular event that provides a wonderful opportunity to gather with new and old friends while viewing amazing artwork.



Please have these forms turned in by **WEDNESDAY, MAY 1** so that we can follow up appropriately.

All medications must be in original containers and given to the nurses or Terry before the trip. If we have medications at school already we will send these with one of the Upper Level teachers.
