My name is Lexy White and I am a freshman Television-Radio major at Ithaca College. I grew up in Syracuse, New York and graduated from West Genesee High School. I was heavily involved in my community at home, participating in varsity sports, coaching sports camps, playing music, and volunteering for Camp Good Days. When I arrived in Ithaca I jumped right into a multitude of activities. I am a member of the sports radio, Ithaca Now on the WICB radio and clubs on campus such as IC Courage and Women in Communications. I also participate in the student run television station at Ithaca College called ICTV. My co-producer, Taryn and I are both passionate about the content that we can create as we both want to go into the television field after graduation. We had the idea to create content for children that will benefit them in a positive way. There is a lot of content in the media that can have negative effects on children and we have the opportunity to do something about this. Our target audience is not only children, but people of all ages. Watching children interact with members of the community and do different segments on a variety of topics can be fun for a wide range of people. Our idea is to create content that is not gender specific while also mentoring children in the field of television and media.

It is our hope that the children of the Montessori school will be just as excited about this project as we are. We need 9 children to be the on screen talent of our Television show. We are pitching the show this semester and if it is approved, we will be in production starting next fall. The 9 children would be on a 3 person rotation every week. We will be filming one episode a week but not all 9 children will be needed each week. We chose 9 children because we understand that families have other commitments and things come up so this way if a child cannot come one week, another child can fill in. We would ideally like children ages to 8 to 13.

Details about exactly what the children will be doing throughout each episode are below in the show proposal. This is a variety show so there will be a monologue at the beginning where that week's child talent will give a rundown of what will happen in the episode. This is followed by the "Word of the Day" segment where we will pick a new and uncommon word for one of the children to talk about and use in different ways. This is followed by the "New News" portion then "This Day in History" will come next. To wrap up the show we will have an interview and a game. All of these segments are relatively short. The entire cast of each episode will be children except for each week's interview subject and the two college students who would come in to play a game with the children. The content is going to be educational, funny and interesting to the children.
